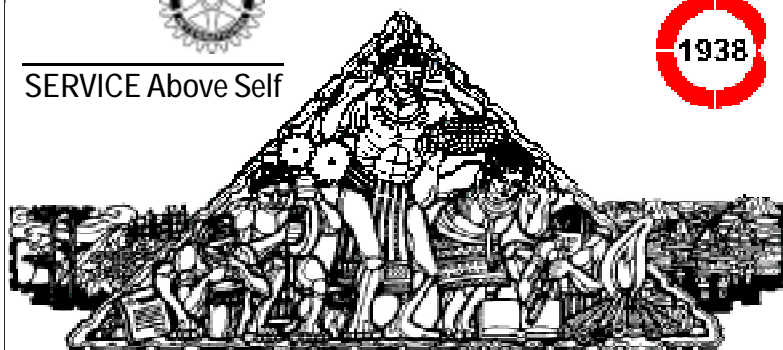

## PRESIDENT'S CORNER



**Experience is not what happens to a man...**

Today is Family Day! I will have to apologize if we are full today in the Benguet Room, as we lost out to a medical convention that is occupying the Training Center upstairs. We had our first medical mission at the Poyopoy Elementary School last Sunday, which turned out to be a very fulfilling day. Our RCC in coordination with Director Bert organized the whole affair as their second project for this Rotary year.

RCB through the coordination of Treasurer Allan and Ann President Maya served the community with our medical and dental skills and we inducted the Rotaractors of SLU-Medicine; the Anns fed the children and ran the pharmacy, the Benguet Central University proposed-Rotaract club came to help, as did the UB-Dentistry group. Hopefully we will be able to induct both proposed-Rotaract clubs in the near future. The day proved special as well, with PE Chris fulfilling his Family of Rotary committee goals—a number of our children were there to help in the pharmacy after they went on a short hike.

We are looking at supporting the Poyopoy Elementary School as part of our Luding Project—the children of Luding go to school there and I think it is appropriate for our Literacy Goals to try and do what we can to uplift the education of our adopted community. The school and the local community are building a library to encourage the kids to read.

They want to promote cleanliness and begin the process of making it a habit for the children to brush their teeth. Further, over 70% of the children have been diagnosed with worms. So, when we receive our Vitamin A from the District Chair, we will incorporate a deworming session for the elementary school and Luding

Directors John Santos and Bert Talco are working with Ben Ladilad to see what the Department of Sciences and Technology (DOST) can do to help us with the Luding Project. So far, we are looking at the potential for DOST to help train Luding residents (between 5 and 10) to process sayote as candy. DOST will then help connect Luding's product to the market.

Director Bert will ask our Luding RCC to prepare a resolution to request the mayor of Tuba's assistance to get BENECO to bring electricity to Luding. Ben Ladilad will then help follow-up with the mayor once the resolution is ready and submitted.


When electricity is available at Luding, DOST can extend another training for making ketchup and ice cream out of sayote. While this is a long term goal (to get electricity into Luding), the process has begun! We are also hoping to get the DOST personnel to assist in training 2-3 Luding residents about composting and integrated pest control management for the vegetable farms.

Club Service Director Flo and program Chair PP Caloy seem to have tied up the dates for guest speakers into October already, so if you have an interesting speaker for the Club, please try and get them into the line-up soon. While Pam Perkins is still on leave, Flo is coordinating the effort to get our Interact Club up and running, so they too can start with their goals and objectives for this year. PP Rene is busy planning our next Club Fellowship. Our attendance figures are up (!) thanks to Secretary Gerard's continuous follow-up.


Lastly, let us support our brother Club, RC Baguio Sunrise, by attending their Induction on Wednesday August 31. The venue is Pineview Hotel (Legarda Road) and the affair starts at 6:00P.M. Another week of being busy—but having fun! My thanks to all the members, your support makes this whole experience so much easier.

As for us members, let us remember (and I know each one of us is aware of this) that peace, harmony, and balance would be attained only when **each of us religiously does whatever is expected of us—our duties and responsibilities not only to ourselves but to the organization where we belong.**

In the end, there'll be more of "**WE, OUR, OURS, US.**" Now, wouldn't that feel fulfilling, heartening, and unifying!!!

## ROTARY INFORMATION



**The First Two "Rotary Anns"**

In 1914, California, USA, Rotarians chartered a train to the international convention in Houston, Texas. It had not yet become customary for wives to accompany their husbands to Rotary conventions, and among the large contingent of Rotarians from 13 West Coast clubs there was but one woman: the wife of San Francisco club president Henry J. "Bru" Brunnier. As the train left the station and the Rotarians—who were used to greeting one another by their first names—met her on board, one of them said, "I don't want to call you Mrs. Brunnier; what is your first name?" She replied, "Ann." The festive group immediately nicknamed her "Our Rotary Ann," and she became so popular during the long train journey that Bru joked he never had to buy her a meal because she was always a guest at another group's table.

Rotary publicized the special West Coast train in advance; so when it arrived in Houston, a large crowd was waiting to welcome it. Some passengers had passed the time by composing a song about "Rotary Ann," and the carnival atmosphere on the platform was heightened when the West Coast group lifted Ann Brunnier on their shoulders and marched around the station, singing their ditty. Buy Gundaker from Philadelphia and his wife were among the reception group, and he mentioned that his wife was also named Ann. The Rotarians lifted her into the air and as they continued their march proclaimed, "From now on, all ladies shall be known as Rotary Anns."

During Rotary's first 84 years, the wives and daughters of Rotarians played a vital role in the organization's success—regardless of whether they belonged to a formal auxiliary. Wives of club members worked alongside them in projects, were equal partners in their financial support, and were often the driving force in urging their spouses to take an active role in the organization's leadership and humanitarian projects.

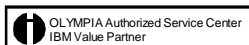
