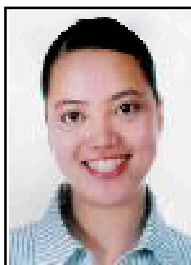

Their Induction will be at our October 01 meeting.

Director Raffy Chan will be doing our third Toast for the year today. PP Alfred and PPLito are supporting Director Raffy with his other International Service goals—I hope you help support their efforts by listening to their "sales pitches" on why you should join their endeavors!


Career guidance seminars are just around the corner with PP Linda taking charge. She may ask some of you to help out—please consider doing so, as the various schools really appreciate our efforts to give the students some insights on what to do with their futures.

## Notice to Club Members

The Board of Directors, through a special committee, would like to re-iterate to all members of the Club the following that is accepted as “standard procedure”.

Any letter that is written with the intention of being distributed to the club membership, must first be approved by the club’s Board of Directors.

Further, so that all members of the club may understand the process of communicating with the Board of Directors on any and all matters that concern, or pertain to the running of the club, the following is the procedure as stated in the Club By-Laws of the Rotary Club of Baguio:

The decision of the Board on all club matters is final, subject only to an appeal (an objection to the Board’s decision) to the club—which must be made in written form and addressed to the Board.

If an appeal to the club is made, a decision of the Board shall be reversed only by a two-thirds vote of the club members present at a meeting specified by the Board, provided a quorum is present and notice of the appeal has been given to each member of the club at least five (05) days prior to the meeting. If an appeal is taken, the action taken by the club shall be final, subject to no further appeal.

## Paul Harris Fellowship

In 1947, when Paul Harris died, RI asked that individuals and clubs wishing to honor the founder make gifts in his name to The Rotary Foundation, suggesting \$10 per member.

Money poured in from all over the world. Thus, in the first year after Harris’s death, the Foundation granted 18 Rotary Foundation Fellowships—later called Ambassadorial Scholarships—for one year’s university study abroad. By 1948, contributions had exceeded \$1,775,000; in addition to granting study fellowships to 37 students from 12 countries, The Rotary Foundation allocated \$15,000 for war-relief assistance to 150 families. By 1954, the Foundation had collected \$3.5 million—and new contributions reached \$500,000 in a single year. In 1955, Rotary’s 50th Anniversary year, it awarded scholarships to 494 young men and women from 57 countries.

The Rotary Foundation had quickly become the successful program that Arch Klumph had long predicted. In 1956, the RI Board urged clubs to give further emphasis to the Foundation during The Rotary Foundation Week, which they decreed be held in mid-November each year. The Secretariat suggested that clubs and districts plan programs publicizing the Foundation during that week, and their efforts were so successful that in 1982 the Trustees changed it to The Rotary Foundation Month, still observed every November.

This ongoing desire to honor Rotary’s founder by making gifts to the Foundation spurred one of the most significant ideas in its history. By 1957, a decade after Paul’s death, donations had begun to decline. The Trustees announced that anyone who contributed \$1,000 to The Rotary Foundation would become a Paul Harris Fellow. Paul Harris Fellows were presented with a plaque, medallion, and lapel pin, all bearing the founder’s likeness. In 1968, the Trustees added a category called Sustaining Member for those who could not give the entire \$1,000 at one time but pledged to give \$100 annually. When they attained the \$1,000, they became Paul Harris Fellows.

We invite all the esteemed members of the Rotary Club of Baguio to consider volunteering to become a Paul Harris Fellow, to better serve our less fortunate brethren. Kindly see PP Alfred Laygo to learn more about our on-going efforts.

## IN RETROSPECT



### The Meeting That Was 17 September 2005

After the very spirited singing of our Pambansang Awit and the Rotary Hymn by almost everybody, Rtn. Fred G was called to the podium as our Entertainment Master. He called on his cousin-guest, in the person of Ms. Irene Mapili, who gave a very professional rendition of “Don’t Cry Out Loud”, after which he ended the Entertainment Portion. He was however prodded by PP Johnny to call on our ever-ready PP Lito who willingly obliged with two love songs, “Minamahal Kita” and “Ikaw Lang Ang Mamahalin”, love songs he dedicated to PP Johnny & PP Veeh, respectively.

The Introduction of Visiting Rotarians & Guests was entertainingly done by Rtn. Joe R. vice the also absent PP Teop. For the Finest Moments, Rtn Joey B. asked the Classification of our members and the name of their spouses, fining those who were able to answer P50 and P100 those who were unable to.

Rtn. Uwe handled the raffle, assisted by the duo of Rtns. Faith & Fred. They gave out wood products, id est mugs, mug holders, spoons & holder, pot holders and a multi-purpose rack. Three members availed of the Members Time but I can just recall Dir./EIC Raffy and Sec. Gerard who requested members to check with him the accuracy of their personal data vis-à-vis our club records.

During the President’s Time, Pres. Mike announced the “fireside chat” this coming Friday will be at Sec. Gerard’s abode, the postponement of the Interact Induction to a later date, and the availability of the material-cloth for our barang.

The Introduction of our GHS was masterfully done by PP Rene, emphasizing that our speaker is also a Cebuano and that the RCBSunrise was lucky for having gotten him as a member before our Club did. Our GHS is the Regional Chief of the CAR-CIDG (Cordillera Criminal Investigation & Detection Group), Police Senior Superintendent (Colonel) Marvin V. Bolabola. He enumerated the cases usually handled by the CIDG which includes organized crimes, syndicates, economic sabotage, major violations of the Revised Penal Code, kidnap for ransom, smuggling, human trafficking, trans-national crimes, illegal firearms & drugs and even the atrocities committed by the CPP & NPA. He also projected the statistics (via PowerPoint) on the most common crimes in the Cordilleras. In Baguio, he said that the most common crime is against persons and property; id est—physical injuries and theft, and opined that liquor-intake is a main cause. He also projected the accomplishments of his unit which made it the Best CIDG Regional Unit nationwide in 2004.

After a well-participated and enlightening Open Forum, Rtn Jody A. delivered the Club’s Response in his usual flair. He focused on a “nude” picture projected during the talk and even suggested a possible change of the speakers surname from Bolabola to Labolabo referring to the positive effects being caused by our speaker to crimes in the Cordillera region.

After the presentation of the Club’s token of Appreciation to our GHS, he even gave out his cell, fax and office numbers to the members with an assurance that we can call him if we need any help. The day’s lively and informative meeting was adjourned at 2:30 P.M.

## Community Service: the Heart of RCB

It is our 11th year of regular outreach Medical Missions and we're still going strong!

If our research efforts through the back issues of our weekly Cañao have not been wanting, RC Baguio's Medical Outreach Programs started as early as 1978, during the Presidency of the late Dr. Sabino "Ben" Macaldao, when RCB sponsored children with cleft lips and palates to undergo plastic and reconstructive surgery. PP Diony Claridad's term saw the implementation of the Polio Plus Program, and PP Benny Sunga's term started a series of medical missions in Asin, where a Barangay Health Center was adopted by the club. In 1994, then President Ruel Baylosis held regular dental and medical missions at Cypress Point in Irisan. Monthly missions becoming the yardstick for future club Presidents to follow.

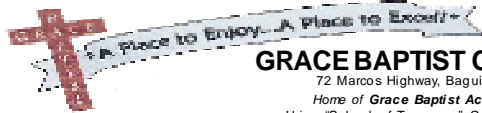
