Welcome to our second Family Day for the current Rotary Year (2007-08). Special welcome to our esteemed and beautiful Rotary Anns who remain our inspiration source.

In behalf of IPP Gerard (our own RCB-TRF expert), we are very proud to announce the forthcoming approval of our Matching Grant Application for computers in line with our Literacy thrust for the year. This has been given by RI the official number of MG 64290. It is jointly funded by: RC Somerset-Pulaski (USA), RC Clare (Australia), and District 9500 (Australia), RCB-Sunrise, and (of course) RC Baguio. For each of the foregoing, a grant (equivalent to fifty percent of the respective club/district donations) will also be released from The Rotary Foundation (TRF).

The summation of all donations and grants comes up to US \$16,800.00 or at P772,800.00 (based on a P46 to \$1 rate of exchange). Said amount will be used to purchase a total of thirty computers and three scanners which will be apportioned among the identified beneficiaries at Poyopoy and Taloy Norte Elementary Schools, and SPED- Baguio. Excellent work, IPP Gerard. Thank you, again.

Being released today is our recently revised Proposed Roster of Filled and Unfilled Classifications. Said document is currently a work in progress; this is because the Classifications SubCommittee has decided on a total revamp on our club listing. The current “re-invention” uses the R.I. Occupational Codes a structure basis. We trust that our roster will be more useful to our members in its present format.

PP Doming Valencia has accepted the challenge of being the new Classifications chairman. PP Johnny Zarate, our former Classifications *czar* remains a member of the SubCommittee; to allow for continuity from within. Kudos to Manong Johnny for all the good work done.


The Governor’s Visit to the club has been confirmed for Saturday, 20 October 07 by Dist. Secretary Mely Alfonso. Everyone is being informed early (particularly our directors) to allow all concerned to program their personal time and make sure that we will be present during that date.

EIC Dhory Vicencio has made it possible for us to facilitate on the Public Relations Billboard project. She gave us a respectfully framed and back-lighted transparency display at the main entrance-exit area of Abanao Square where our RCB advertisement sign can be placed. It has a size of 40 x 60 inches—I had hoped that our unit measure would have been in feet. But EIC Dhory explains that this can become a reality later, once a bigger ad space becomes available within her command premises.


Our sign has already been printed and will be in place by this weekend. Again, thank you to EIC Dhory. Kindly relay our thanks to the owners of Abanao Square also, for making the space available—*gratis*.



KNOW OUR NEW MEMBER

FRANCISCO “PING” ALAFRIZ PARAAN

It was no easy climb for Ping Paraan, who in his young days was newsboy, shoeshine boy, pony boy, tennis pulot boy, caddy boy, a working student in college, fought in Bataan in WWII, joined the infamous Death March, was a prisoner of war for almost six months, a guerilla fighter, was Chief of Police, Vice President of Benguet Corporation—the biggest gold mine in the Far East with 26,000 employees at that time, Mayor of Baguio, mine consultant for five mining companies, and a host of other jobs and positions in-between.

Born of poor parents, the family had a difficult time making both ends meet. His father and mother ran a tailoring shop sewing police and constabulary uniforms. The demand being seasonal, the shop yielded meager income for a family of seven. There were times when the children wondered whether there would be some food on the table or no candle for light. As they grew up, they found that there was plenty of both and one just had to go out and work to get them.

Graduating from the Mountain Province High School (BCNHS) in 1935, he worked as a miner to earn tuition money to study at the Gregg Business College in Manila, finishing a course in steno typewriting. His first job was janitor at the Western Equipment & Supply Co. in Baguio, later as clerk typist.

In December 1945, he was ordered to report to the guerilla headquarters in Kapangan. He led the 66th First Batallion fighting along Naguilian Road with US Army units culminating in the liberation of Baguio in 27 April 1945.

In 1944, he married the former Virginia Abellera Aspillaga, reputed woman civic leader in her own right, with whom he had eight children—now all professionals. Jean passed away in 29 December 1974. Ping married Emilie Alvear Magalong, an accountant in 21 June 1997.

In 03 March 1986, he was appointed by Pres. Corazon Aquino to be the OIC Mayor of Baguio. To him, being mayor was a nightmare—there being no Constitution, no Congress, no Senate, just ample funds in the city coffers. While mayor, graft and corruption in City Hall virtually disappeared. He shuffled five police chiefs during his stint. Public bidding for city infrastructure projects was transparent.

In 2000, he went to the States with Emilie, to seek medical treatment at the US Veterans Administration. He enjoyed full veteran's medical benefits because his heart problem and stress syndrome were connected with his medical service with the USAFFE and the army.

In his return to Baguio in 2007, having confirmed of this intent to permanently settle in the city, he was recruited and promptly inducted to the Rotary Club of Baguio.

The colorful life of a respected “Baguio institution” such as Ping Paraan cannot possibly be fully appreciated in a one-page biographical sketch (such as this). It is sufficient to say that he is one who has fully lived his life and accomplished much in the process.

Ping Paraan is one person who did not take advantage of his positions in government and private industry nor his political positions to enrich himself. The only job he has ever applied for was as janitor, the rest were offered to him or sought him.

RCB is happy to welcome back our former member who can share a wealth of experience in life; Rtn. Ping is now officially the most senior (in age) member of our club. He is a feather in our Rotary cap, and we will look forward in anticipation to the abundance of wisdom he can share with us.

ROTARY ATTIRE



Essential Information for the Polished Rotarian

Different ATTIRE Rotarians are requested to wear and what they mean.

1. FORMAL:

This is very ambiguous in our beloved Philippines. Its meaning depends entirely on who's giving the invite. Generally, for Rotarians, it simply means a dark suit and tie, and long gowns for our Lady Rotarians. Strictly speaking, it means white tie and coattails. The Penguin look. In the Philippines, however, a Barong Tagalog for the menfolk will often do.

2. BLACK TIE:

This spells it out. When an invite specifies "black tie", the host really means it is a tuxedo. But Rotarians are very forgiving, so a black suit plus white shirt and a black, silver or white necktie will be acceptable. A black long gown is the counterpart for Lady Rotarians.

3. BUSINESS:

In Corporate Culture, this unambiguously means a suit and a tie. Do not omit the tie or the jacket.

4. SMART CASUAL:

Another ambiguous prescription. Best to err on the side of formality. Rotarians suggest a long-sleeved shirt buttoned at the cuff (folding of the sleeves is a No No!) plus brown or cream colored trousers. Black pants tend to make you look like rank and file.

5. CASUAL CHIC:

A favorite of fashion industry events, it actually encourages guests to display their trendiest clothes. One suggestion is a white, slim cut shirt without a pocket, buttoned at the cuff, silky black trousers and black, pointy-toed shoes.

6. CASUAL WEAR:

Means a pique shirt (cotton woven shirt with collar) or polo shirt with chinos pants. Jeans may be worn here. Definitely NOT allowed for Rotary meetings.
