PRESIDENT'S CORNER



**Cui peccare licet

Once again I have the pleasant opportunity to welcome our Rotary Anns to this special Family (Ladies') Day meeting in the club. It seems like only yesterday that we had the October Family Day (when my spouse had the honor of being the GHS) and here we are—again, with the next one.

To all our others guests—family and friends, we warmly welcome you to the second-to-the-last Family Day for the current year. The final 2007 RCB Family Day will be our Christmas Party.

As we end November and The Rotary Foundation (TRF) Month, allow me to reconcile and comment on our club's Recognition Summary. This is the list-consolidation from Rotary International, which your president has recently sent out (via Internet e-mail) to all our club members. Did you know?— only the current club president and secretary are allowed to download this information from the RI website? It should become an RCB standard for each current president to provide our Rotarians an update (at the very least) at the end of each Rotary semester.

The report (in the form of a PDF file) gives a running total on how much our club has given to TRF and the names of all donors and the amounts given by each. For the RCB, our All-Time Giving to this date is US\$69,614.34; which at the current rate of exchange of (say) Php 44.00, converts to about Php3.06 Million Pesos. Over a span of our 69 years, we have averaged with an annual giving of Php44,390.00. Stated in another way, our average is one PHF per year over our club's lifetime. Our members will be the judge of how good we have fared. Is our average of one PHF per year good enough for you?

This year, your president has committed to give two PHFs: one was paid for last month (October) and the second one paid for just last Thursday, 22 Nov 07—both as Restricted Contributions. I will confess that it is only this year that I have learned about the details involved in making these contributions to The Rotary Foundation. Maybe it was because I never found true appreciation in doing so; or shall I say— never found any need to learn the full details (until the current time).





As we studied the list of contributors, it dawned on me that almost all our recent past president have obliged with “leading the way” with their respective-personal PHF contributions. It is equally important to note that most of them are actually double Paul Harris Fellows. Your current president is honored to follow this “tradition of giving.”

And why do we give to TRF? The Rotary Foundation is the central repository of the Funds/money of Rotary International. It is through it that TRF Programs get funded and become a reality, such as the Humanitarian Grants, Educational Programs, and Polio Plus.

Through it, Rotary has been able to do a lot already. We are closing-in on the eradication of polio precisely because we have The Rotary Foundation. Much more needs to be done, so let us take up the challenge of giving—if we have the chance and the means.

Our Latin quotation for this week is from Ovid— *Cui peccare licet peccat minus*. Literally means: One who is allowed to sin, sins less. Do we sin precisely because we love doing what is forbidden? If so, when something is no longer forbidden—it no longer becomes as enjoyable as it once was (when still forbidden).

Then came Members’ Time. It was announced that a report on our membership update was sent to the editor for publishing. All groups for the Club Management and Growth should produce their reports as soon as possible.

Director Mia Cawed reported on Medical Missions and invited all who could make it to come and participate on Nov. 25 for a special Medical & Dental mission. This will be a meeting at Kayapa, Bakun, Benguet. Meeting of participants at 4:00 pm and shall leave promptly at 5:00 pm from Baguio Achiever’s Academy.

After PP Linda Winter’s speech, no questions were asked thus PP Diony Claridad delivered the Club’s Response by thanking PP Linda for sharing her expertise regarding the Group Study Exchange Program of the Rotary Foundation. President-in-charge Uwe Koeller presented the Plaque of Appreciation to our Club Speaker with the usual picture-taking.

PP Linda Winter started the informal dialogue with the announcement of the Club’s Christmas Party on 15 Dec 15 07 at 12:00 NN to 4:00 PM at the rooftop of the Abanao Square. She mentioned the chairpersons of the different committee such as Registration, Raffle, Physical Arrangement, Emcees etc. PP Benny Sunga volunteered to reserve spaces at the Munsayac Compound Parking Lot for free parking during the party.

The body upon the motion of PP Diony Claridad unanimously approved a proposal to postpone the second Club Fellowship from Dec 01 to Jan 2008 which will be recommended to the Board of Directors for final action. PP Linda Winter then tossed the question of how to improve attendance in our regular meetings. PP Doming Valencia mentioned the fact that there are too numerous make-ups allowed nowadays such as board meetings, committee meetings, necrological services and even Internet make-ups. PP Benny Sunga suggested that our Club’s Board of directors should look into it and control these make-ups by recognizing only valid club’s activities. PP Teop Rondez agreed with the controlling of make-ups by the Club’s board. PP Alfred Laygo mentioned that our Saturday meetings usually comes in conflict with district functions, professional seminars, conventions and post-graduate courses which are usually scheduled on weekends. Dir. Cecille Apostol talked about a survey of asking the real reasons why some Rotarians have not been attending our Club meetings. PP Doming Valencia mentioned that the Club have been meeting on Saturdays since its inception and then summed up our recommendations to improve attendance by controlling make-ups, by appointing a separate Attendance Chairperson aside from the Club’s Secretary who is already very busy with his work and that PP Chris Peralta will transmit all these recommendations to our President for the Board’s action. There are other matters taken up: problem on personal differences, comments on President’s corner and concern on who is acting as our Canao’s editor-in-chief.

To his excitement, OIC President Uwe adjourned the meeting before the singing of the Pilipinas Kong Mahal by the 12 remaining members. Rtn. Pam Perkins did a good job as Program Coordinator in today’s informal yet enjoyable and educational regular meeting program. Parting words and handshakes at about 3 PM.

Embracing New Information Be Open

Living in an information age, it is easy to become overwhelmed by the constant influx of scientific studies, breaking news, and even spiritual revelations that fill our bookshelves, radio waves, and in-boxes. No sooner have we decided what to eat or how to think about the universe than a new study or book comes out confounding our well-researched opinion. After a while, we may be tempted to dismiss or ignore new information in the interest of stabilizing our point of view, and this is understandable. Rather than closing down, we might try instead to remain open by allowing our intuition to guide us.

Perhaps the key is realizing that we are not going to finally get to some stable place of having it all figured out. Throughout our lives we will go through the processes of opening to new information, integrating it, and stabilizing our worldview. No sooner will we have reached some kind of stability then it will be time to open again to new information, which is inherently destabilizing. If we see ourselves as surfers riding the incoming waves of information and inspiration, always open and willing to attune ourselves to the next shift, we will see how blessed we are to have this opportunity to play on the waves and, most of all, to enjoy the ride.
