IN RETROSPECT



The Meeting That Was 24 November 07

November 24 2007, The Rotary Club of Baguio is meeting at the Baguio Country Club. President Raffy Chan called the meeting to order at 12:30 PM. The Invocation was led by RAPP Coring Visperas as the representative of the Anns for this Family Day's Meeting. The singing of the Pambansang Awit and the Rotary Hymn followed. The Program Coordinator was the indefatigable IPP Gerard Audineau while the photographer was Rtn. Chris Faelnar. The Entertainment was organized by the Anns, particularly by RAPP Yolly Faelnar who asked PP Diony Claridad to sing for us. His rendition of "Portrait of my love" was again very impressive.

The introduction of guests followed, given by now President- Elect Bert Talco.

PP Doming Valencia was the Fine Master and he promised to make it short for three reasons: it was a Family Day; we have an interesting Guest of Honor and Speaker; it was Election Day. He commented however that perhaps it should still be named Ladies' Day as there was no Rota-Kid present. He mentioned that he is inspired by a Rotarian Steve who wrote in the Cañao in 1987 that "*who is fining without giving any entertainment is painful*". So we were entertained for almost 22 minutes and paid with joy.

The raffle was again prepared the Anns. RAPP Cynthia Meadows was the raffle queen for the day and ticket costs only Php 20.00. We had three double winner: RAPP Josie, Dir. Mia and RAPP Yolly...lucky ladies!

In Members' Time PP Linda announced that the assessment for the RCB Christmas Party will be Php 350.00 for adult participants while for children of nine years and below the assessment fee is Php 150.00 only. Rtn. Chris informed everyone that the 2nd Fellowship Night on 01 Dec 07 will push through and will be held at the residence of PP Diony at Gibraltar Road. There will be "no assessment" for the 2nd Fellowship Night as the birthday celebrants will provide the dinner.

PP Mike explained the mechanics of election, particularly the four board members to be elected.

IPP Gerard announced that the Matching Grant for the 10 computers had been accepted by Rotary International within 5 days only. This indicates that "they" like it very much.

IPP Gerard also reminded everyone about the PHF raffle and the Rotary Car Raffle.

IPP Gerard continued and led the salute for the Rotary Club of Mugeug, R.I. District 3740, from the City of Eumsung, Chungcheongbug, South Korea. Everyone rose and raised their glasses for RCB's ninth salute.

Dir. Mia announced that the MeDeLeg in Kayapa, Bakun for tomorrow has been cancelled temporarily as typhoon Mina is coming to the Mountain Provinces soon.

During President's Time, Pres. Raffy reiterated that the MeDeLeg is postponed and that the Grand Fellowship Night will push through and announced that the Midyear Review will be on 12 January 08 at 5PM at the Garden Fiesta in Vigan. Birthday greetings were given to celebrants RAPP Coring Visperas and PN Bert Talco.

EIC Dhory introduced our GHS, Prof. Harland Gary B. Pawid, who is known to his friends as Mercury. His topic was Physical Fitness Program, and he spoke about exercise and health care. He explained to us the health benefits of exercise like aerobic exercises, walking, swimming and cycling. For the greatest overall health benefits experts recommend that you exercise 20-30 minutes, three times a week. Why do we need fitness and exercise? Do we have the time to be involved with this? You can do it indoor or outdoor. But not too much! To control yourself we learned about the THR, the Target Heart Rate. First you measure your pulse. You take it 10 seconds and multiply with 6. You get the THR then when you calculate 220 minus your actual age. Your minimum THR at the beginning of the exercise should be your THR x 0.6, your maximum THR should be THR x 0.88. After 15 minutes of exercise measure your THR. If you are still ok, you are allowed to exercise 15 minutes more. Do not over exercise as the program is fitness, not sickness. To be F.I.T. take a look at = Frequency, Intensity, Time = or = How Often, How Hard, How Long = 12 repetition is always one cycle if you do exercise; important is to cool down after the exercise. Exercise is especially good for young, teens, and old persons. At the end of his speech he told us why his nickname is Mercury. His initials are Hg, the chemical sign for - Mercury.

The Open Forum followed, then PP Mike Pearson gave the response. Thereafter, Pres. Raffy gave the Plaque of Appreciation.

Next was the announcement of the newly elected officers and the candidates for the position of President Nominee. PP Mike asked first who among the elected directors prefer "not to serve as President". Dir. Ike Dulnoan, Dir. Cecille Apostol, Sec. Uwe Koeller and EIC Dhory Vicencio raised their hands. So we filled our second ballot for the election of the President to choose among Dir Mia Cawed, VP Ben Ladilad and Treas. Marilyn Barredo.

During the counting of the votes PP Doming Valencia motioned that IPP Gerard be placed again in the Board (for Dir. Emil Dayrit who is very busy with his job at the moment), this was seconded by PP Mike, and there was no objection. Then, the Club President of RC Baguio for RY 2009-10 was announced... no other than PN Mia Cawed. Congratulations!

The Pilipinas Kong Mahal was sung, and the meeting was adjourned at 3:08 PM.

Christmas To Me

Many Christmas have come and gone-nearly two thousand of them- and though the centuries, the event of Christmas has taken on various connotations and various ways of celebrations. To some people Christmas is Santa Claus, a Christmas tree. To others, it is fund-raising through caroling which, in our country, lasts for almost a month. For still others, it is a gift-giving and the time to renew old friendships. Whatever meaning it holds and whatever way it is celebrated, joy pervades the atmosphere everywhere.

And this all started on one bleak night long ago, in Bethlehem, when God gave to man his only begotten son as a gift for Peace and Good Will. Significant events characterize the birth of the Lord. A signal star appeared in the heaven for the first time. And the Son of God was born in the humblest of places- out in the hills, in a manger – because we had no place in the dwellings of affluent society. His first visitors were the people with the humblest of hearts, the shepherds with the simplest ways and the lowliest aspirations. Theirs was the honor to receive the first message from the Angel of the Lord who come upon them and said: “I bring you good tidings and great joy, which shall be to all people. The savior is born- wrap in swaddling clothes- in a manger”.

And a multitude of heavenly hosts burst out singing the greatest theme song that ever was sung in the universe –GLORY TO GOD IN THE HIGHEST, AND ON EARTH – PEACE, GOODWILL TOWARD MEN.

Since then, that great symphony of Peace and Goodwill, has been played from year to year every Christmas Season. Goodwill toward one another is expressed through gifts given not in the Spirit of charity but in the spirit of Christmas love.

That theme of Peace and Goodwill, however, has had a variety of interpretations. To some, it heralds a message from the Creator, offering peace and goodwill towards men, his creatures. A great forgiving God – offering understanding to man, whom he loves – forgiving man’s weakness, and trespasses- accepting man with all his faults and misgivings- and His only son to set the example of Christian life, so that man may merit Christ’s heavenly home.

Another interpretation runs thus: Peace on earth to men of good will. This interpretation emphasizes man’s freedom and responsibility to determine his faith in this globe.

If peace be important, in the brief sojourn of man in this valley of tears, he has to have goodwill toward his fellows, for goodwill toward one another is the foundation of workable peace amongst us. Peace therefore, is a grant to men of good will. And God sent to earth his only son so that he may teach us, through precepts and examples a way life conducive to the promotion of the peace we so earnestly need.

There may be other interpretations of this Christmas message, but whatever they may be-there is a common thread running through them, binding them together- the thread of goodwill in itself-wishing good for each other- granting each other the right to his own errors- and accepting the fact that we are entitled to our individual differences, because that is the way God created all of us and the whole world. Peace on earth is the great message of Christmas. It is the assignment for us to accomplish- an assignment well delineated and expressed. God has shown us how He can humble in all his greatness- how in his omnipotence He can unbend- How in his wisdom He can be tolerant- how in his justice He can be forgiving. Peace on earth is given to man as his responsibility to attain.

With the patience and trust of job, and the understanding and cognizance of our own humanity, accepting each other’s weakness, forgiving each other’s errors, we will ultimately come upon the avenue which leads toward the glory of God in the Highest- the avenue of PEACE.

10 Reasons We Should Care About Water, The Essence of Life

from Rotary eclub one

1. Every 15 seconds, a child dies from drinking contaminated water.
2. More than 2.2 million people, mostly in developing countries, die each year from diseases associated with poor water and unsanitary conditions.
3. Only 1% of the total water resources on earth is available for human use. While 70% of the world's surface is covered by water, 97.5% of that is salt water. Of the remaining 2.5% that is freshwater, almost 68.7% is frozen in ice caps and glaciers.
4. Water scarcity already affects every continent and more than 40% of the people on our planet.
5. There are 1.1 billion people, or 18% of the world's population, who lack access to safe drinking water. About 2.6 billion people, or 42% of the total, lack access to basic sanitation.
6. By 2025, it is estimated that about two thirds of the world's population - about 5.5 billion people - will live in areas facing moderate to severe water stress.
7. The world's population is expected to increase to approximately 7.2 billion people by 2015. Almost 95% of the increase is expected to be in developing regions.
8. In an industrialized city with plenty of water, flushing the lavatory in an average household can send up to 50 litres (13 gallons) of water down the drain every day. Yet more than one in six people worldwide - 1.1 billion - don't have access to 20-50 litres of safe freshwater daily, the minimum range suggested by the UN to ensure each person's basic needs for drinking, cooking and cleaning.
9. About 90% of sewage and 70% of industrial wastes in developing countries are discharged into water courses without treatment, often polluting the usable water supply.
10. The economic payback from investing US\$11.3 billion per year to reach the Millennium targets for drinking water and sanitation by 2015 is estimated to be US\$ 84 billion.
