Because your president will be away today to attend the Mid-Year Review in Vigan, we have asked PN Mia Cawed to preside today's RCB meeting. We trust that she can start being comfortable at the head table and you (our esteemed members) having her there; in preparation for R.Y. 2009-10.

It is often an interesting matter to discuss the number of make-ups credited at district activities. At times, the activities run for several hours—if not several days.

Take for example the activities this Saturday where we will attend the District Nominating Committee (DNC) meeting that starts at three o'clock. Rotary Anns Club of RCB Mid-year Accomplishment Report

A. COMMUNITY SERVICE

1. Supported the training of 2 RCC Luding Ladies on "Fruit Wine Making" held on 18-19 September 07 at the DOST Car Conference Room, La Trinidad, Benguet by providing their registration fee and fare to and from the venue. The lecturers are from the DOST Industrial Technology Development Institute. The Participants were: Ms. Irene Taltalen and Ms. Eloisa Calisan.
2. Supported the training of one RCC Luding Lady on "Mushroom Production" held at Benguet State University Mushroom Project on 20-21 September 07 with the project in-charge as the lecturer/demonstrator. RCB Anns provided the registration fee and the fare to and from the venue.

THE CAÑO A Celebration of Service

Our Official Club Bulletin has been called The Caño. "Caño" (*pronounced as kan-yau*) is actually the local term for the dance during native feasts or celebrations in the highlands of the Cordilleras- in Northern Luzon of the Philippines.

This is depicted in our Caño emblem (above) which shows a number of human figures in deep concentration—absorbed in ritual dance.

The attention, focus, commitment and unity of the club's members is represented by the dancing figures—in celebration or expectation of a bountiful harvest; much as we actually do—in anticipation of the joy derived from public service to the community—always coupled with fellowship. Hence, the sub-title of "A Celebration of Service."

The Rotary Club of Baguio (RCB) was chartered on 21 February 1938. The 4,587th member of Rotary International and the oldest club organized North of Manila; the 6th chartered Rotary Club in the entire Philippines.

Our over-simplified club logo (red) is a composite of the letters r, c & B; this is symbolic of the club's straightforwardness. Over-all cardioid-heart shape connotes that our members serve from the heart. The four basic elements (four quadrants—now 3D bevelled) are symbolic of Rotary's Four-Way Test and the members' commitment to it. Our charter year of 1938 is used as the mid-focal point of the logo, to emphasize our early beginnings and continuing dedication to *Service Above Self*.
