Baguio, 29 March 2008

At about 7:00 AM a group of RCB rotarians, rotary anns, rotakids, rotaractors led by Commander PP Chris Peralta and PE Mia Cawed in a convoy of several vans and suvs motored down Naguilian road on the way to Alilem, Ilocos Sur. This group composed the 9nth Alilem Medical-Dental Mission.

The caravan stopped over at San Fernando, La Union for breakfast, and over bites of burgers, pancakes, sips of coffee and chocolate, the party was given opportune time for banter and pleasantries. A much needed stretching of legs and limbs, well rested and invigorated the mission traveled the final leg of the journey to Alilem.

Reaching the northernmost town of La Union, Supiden, the motorcade manned by Luzon Hydro Corp. personnel turned eastward on cemented roads astocide the upper banks of the Amburayan river.

The Amburayan river is bordered on the south by the province of La Union and on the north by Ilocos Sur. To reach the town of Alilem, on has to cross this body of water farther east, possible only during the summer months. Thus before the year 2005 Commander Chris Peralta steered the vehicle caravan

across shallow waters under the able direction of his navigator Chris Faelnar. At its widest the river is about a mile, and according to the inhabitants what is once a shallow river laying its way around, sand, gravel and moss covered boulders, turns, during the rainy season, into a swift rampaging rapids of white water, at times overflowing the banks of the Amburayan gulf. A new concrete bridge built in 2005 now spans the water lanes traversed by the first mission.

From across the bridge, north, a concrete paved winding road led us to the final destination and after about 20 minutes drive the verdant hills of Alilem came into view.

As time goes by, natural and man made events usually alter the landscape, the skyline of a place. Alilem is no exception. The grassy plaza fronting the town hall on the east is now flanked by a one storey administration building, a multi-purpose hall, a police station on the north, and the Rural Health Unit, a brand new Senior Citizens Hall, auxiliary buildings on the south. West of the square is a basketball court size covered gymnasium. It is a welcome sight to see the well tended hedges, the clean surroundings and most of all the old grand acacia tree majestically lording over the mangoes, the coconut leaves still sway with the wind fanning the cool breezes. Nature is kind, the lovely green hills still stand like sentinels and silent chroniclers to the life of this mountainside town.

The medical missionaries arrived at past 10:00 AM to a very warm welcome by the Alilem folks led by amiable Mayor Onofre B. Bistayong after which a brief program was held at the gymnasium where the patients and other town residents were assembled. Members of the party was introduced. Intermissioned by the rendering of welcome and other songs by the town's choir were speeches by the mayor, PP Chris Peralta, Rtn. Chris Faelnar, and PN Mia Cawed.

A very well coordinated organized setting up of the gym pharmacy, the dental facilities at the multipurpose centers, and the surgical equipment tables at the Rural Health Unit building was done in perfect unison by the rotarians, rotakids, rotaractors, Luzon Hydro Corp. personnel, the town officials and residents. The 9nth Alilem Medical-Dental Mission was underway.

And this is when my taxi driver told me what I now call, "The Law of the Garbage Truck."

Many people are like garbage trucks. They run around full of garbage, full of frustration, full of anger, and full of disappointment.

As their garbage piles up, they need a place to dump it. And if you let them, they'll dump it on you.

When someone wants to dump on you, don't take it personally. You just smile, wave, wish them well, and move on. You'll be happy you did.

So this was it: The "Law of the Garbage Truck." I started thinking, how often do I let Garbage Trucks run right over me?

And how often do I take their garbage and spread it to other people: at work, at home, on the streets? It was that day I said, "I'm not going to do it anymore."

I began to see garbage trucks. Like in the movie "The Sixth Sense," the little boy said, "I see Dead People."

Well, now "I see Garbage Trucks." I see the load they're carrying. I see them coming to drop it off. And like my Taxi Driver, I don't make it a personal thing; I just smile, wave, wish them well, and I move on. One of my favorite football players of all time, Walter Payton, did this every day on the football field.

He would jump up as quickly as he hit the ground after being tackled. He never dwelled on a hit.

Payton was ready to make the next play his best.

Good leaders know they have to be ready for their next meeting. Good parents know that they have to welcome their children home from school with hugs and kisses. Leaders and parents know that they have to be fully present, and at their best for the people they care about.

The bottom line is that successful people do not let Garbage Trucks take over their day. What about you?

What would happen in your life, starting today, if you let more garbage trucks pass you by?

Here's my bet. You'll be happier.

Life's too short to wake up in the morning with regrets, so...

Love the people who treat you right.

Forget about the ones who don't.

Believe that everything happens for a reason.

If you get a chance, TAKE IT!

If it changes your life, LET IT!


