GHS'S PROFILE

JUAN ALBERTO GAERLAN

Hailed by one critic as "a revelation not only as a singer but also an actor", when he essayed the role of Tony Candolino in the Philippine Opera Company's 2006 season production of Terrence McNally's "The Master Class", Juan Alberto is fast becoming one of the most sought-after tenors in the Philippines. Having started out at an early age singing with the Saint Louis Boys' High School Choir as Alto Soloist. He later represented the school and the City of Baguio at the National Music Competition for Young Artists (NAMCYA) in 1980, bringing home honor. His initial success at the NAMCYA was to be repeated in 1982 and then again in 1986 as Juan Alberto established his place as a multi-awarded soloist.

This caught the attention of the late Dean Rey T. Paguio of the UP College of Music who offered Juan Alberto an opportunity to join the University of the Philippines Concert Chorus in their 5th and 6th international tours, and to study voice at the Conservatory under Fides Cuyugan-Asencio.

Juan Alberto, underwent rigorous training under the renowned Soprano, Irma P.E. Potenciano in preparation for the Rosa Ponselle International Voice Competition at Washington D.C. His remarkable talent, now honed to a greater fullness and sensitivity, was not lost on Maestro Igor Chichagov, Rosa Ponselle Foundation's musical director and chairman of the jury, who took him as a personal scholar and protégé.

In his quest to further his voice technique, he also trained under British Bass Baritone Michael Rippon, Hong Kong Soprano Ella Kiang, Australian Tenor Kevin Miller and Metropolitan Opera Baritone, Mark Oswald.

In the last few years Gaerlan has played the role of the sympathetic anthropologist Gustavo Nierderlien in Floy Quintos' Filipino musical *St. Louis Loves dem Filipinos* with Franco Laurel and Isay Alvarez. He was featured in the POC's production of *OperaNow* and *An Evening of Puccini* where he sang the role of Goro in scenes from *Madama Butterfly* at the CCP with the Philippine Philharmonic Orchestra conducted by Japanese conductor Yasuo Shinozaki.

Gaerlan has performed as a soloist in concerts with the Philippine Philharmonic Orchestra, China Philharmonic Orchestra and the Hong Kong Bach Choir and Orchestra. He made his operatic debut singing Roberto in the Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts production of Giacomo Puccini's *Le Villi*.

After studying under a Rosa Ponselle scholarship in New York City, Gaerlan completed his professional diploma studies in western opera at the Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts where he graduated with distinction. He also holds a bachelor in secondary education, major in music from the University of Baguio.

2008 will be a busy year. Amongst all his singing engagements from the start of this year till next December, he is working on his first cd album scheduled to be launched in time before his solo concert at the Teatrino to be presented by the Philippine Opera Company and directed by Floy Quintos. Gaerlan will also essay the role of Rudolfo in Puccini's *La Boheme* at the Cultural Center of the Philippines in October.

At present he is a Resident Artist of the Philippine Opera Company and the University of Baguio, and the musical director / adviser of the UB Voices Chorale.

The plant itself is state of the art, fully computerized installation operating 4 turbines with a generating capacity of 13,800 volts which supplies electricity to several towns in La Union and Ilocos Sur. For more technical information it is recommended that one visits the plant in a guided tour of which Engr. Chris Faelnar, the general manager will give an expert detailed explanation on how the plant operates. Luzon Hydro Corp. has supplied fore free the electric power lines, transformers for the 9 barangays of Alilem. Added to this is its corporate social responsibility project, the Alilem Annual Medical-Dental Mission in partnership with the Rotary Club of Baguio. During the 9 years of the mission, Luzon Hydro Corp provided transportation, food and accommodations for the participants.

Zuelore Pharma with representative former rotarian Allan Branzuela donated boxes of medicines for the mission.
