The Meeting That Was 24 May 08

During fellowship time on 24 May 24 08, the Program Coordinator Aud. Rolly De Guzman could be seen scurrying about looking for pitch-ins among the members for participants in the programme, who for good reason were absent because of the District Assembly in Clark. He trusts in the ability and willingness of members to perform tasks spontaneously. He also thinks and in fact mentioned that it is uncharacteristic for the Rotary Club of Baguio to be late in keeping schedules. As he arrived early, PP Doming Valencia was there to greet and amuse the Guest of Honor and Speaker who came with his wife and daughter. It turned out that it was he who invited the GHS who he knew from way way back. Vice-Pres. Ben Ladilad called the meeting to order at 12:30 PM.

Although Crooners may say singing is twice praying, Rtn. Angie Visperas believes the Invocation should be delivered in utmost reverence, and he took this chance to render a very fervent and awe-inspiring invocation that made no other than PP Johnny Zarate comment "Ann Coring Visperas is really a good writer". Everyone sang the Pambansang Awit and the Rotary Hymn. The Program Coordinator Aud. Rolly opted to scratch the "Entertainment" and "Finest Moment" to give more time for our GHS.

In lieu of Dir Cecile Apostol, Aud. Rolly introduced those at the head table. Next, he introduced the guests Mrs. Gloria Q. Caccam, wife of the GHS and Pomona Q. Caccam, their daughter.

Rtn. Pam Perkins officiated in the raffle draw, which produced only P800.00. There were only four winners: PP Roger Naz, Aud. Rolly, VP Ben, and Rtn. Angie.

During Members' Time, Rtn. Pam solicited the help of the member Rotarians for the Regreening Movement through the purchase of raffle tickets.

VP Ben made use of the "President's Time" to thank and congratulate all who joined our Twelfth RCB Golf Fellowship Last Thursday, 22 May 08, and whose presence and help made the tournament a success.

Instead of PN Mia Cawed who joined the District Assembly, our very able extemporaneous speaker PP Doming generously introduced the GHS, Engr. Pio E. Caccam, with an account of their acquaintance and a litany of his professional successes.

After thanking PP Doming for the introduction Engr. Pio E. Caccam said that a speech should entertain, be informative and current such that it will evoke reactions among the audience. He said his topic: Trends in the Mining Industry is so vast that it will need a "wider forum" so he decided to concentrate on the acute lack of skilled workers in a resurgent mining industry. He mentioned that the Philippines is the second largest in the world in terms of density in minerals. He then turned over the podium to his daughter who heads the PIMQ or Philippine Institute of Mining and Quarrying.

The Open Forum started with PP Mike Pearson voicing out his concern about environmental mistakes committed by old mines. Since these old mines are no longer there, who should correct their environmental mistakes (no mines, no rehabilitation)? Mona explained that this is the "legacy mines" issue that civil society groups keep harping about. Ideally, rehabilitation should be done by the original mines, but since they no longer exists, the Chamber of Mines should do it, but again since the chamber of mines does not have the funds, the government should help. On the issue of investments, PP Doming suggested that the end of the parity rights agreement caused the hesitation of foreign investors to enter the country. The 60:40 sharing is now mandated in our new mining law. Incidentally it took ten years to forge this law. Thanks to Environmentalists, if it were not for the help of the Supreme Court, the New Mining Act would still not be implemented even after another ten years. In fact this Mining Act is the most stringent in the world. ECC under this law is the most difficult to obtain. The community can easily control the mining company on the three phases of its activity, during exploration, extraction, and processing.

PP Doming asked how will PIMQ guarantee its graduates? The retort was the hands on training is on site itself. Philex Mining Corporation was chosen because it is the only corporation which has ISO 14001 in place and has 27M funds in its SDMP. EPA believes EMSs, under ISO 14001, if implemented properly, could serve as a valuable tool to help organizations improve their environmental performance, increase the use of pollution prevention, and improve compliance. EMSs could, in the future, serve as the basis for providing regulatory flexibility to organizations that successfully implement them.

The answer to Rtn. Joe Ramos query regarding the exodus of mining engineers during the slowdown of the mining industry was: M.E.s went to cement factories, oil corporations, and/or collaborated with C.E.s in real estate. His follow-up question "Why the government cannot recognize the indicated interest of investors was not categorically answered.

PP Diony Claridad quipped that he regretted not having become a mining engineer because then he would be able to play golf everyday to which the golfers of the club had a hearty laugh. Anyway, he believes he is still a miner because he extracts stones albeit from gall bladders and kidneys.

For the Response Rtn. Joe apologized in behalf of the Club for having only one plaque for both speakers. He applauded Pomona's very respectful interaction towards her mother who handled the computer. Rtn. Joe then thanked the Speakers by way of presenting the RCB's plaque of appreciation through VP Ben.

After singing the Pilipinas Kong Mahal by the body, the meeting ably coordinated by Aud. Rolly was adjourned at 2: 57 PM by VP Ben.



FACE TO FACE WITH R.I. PRESIDENT-ELECT DONG KURN LEE

RI President-elect Dong Kurn Lee sat down with Vince Aversano, editor in chief of *The Rotarian*, to talk about how he plans to tackle his year in office as RI's first Korean president.

[Q] President-elect Lee, what would you hope to accomplish next year as president?

I would like to see progress made in polio, both in terms of meeting the Gates [Foundation] challenge grant and in reducing the number of polio-endemic countries. I would also like to see child mortality, the terrible tragedy of preventable deaths of children, become something that every Rotarian is aware of. Every day, 30,000 children under the age of five die, most of them from preventable causes like measles, malaria, and pneumonia. I want people to realize that every day, a disaster of this size is happening. But it is also important to remember how much we have already done, and how far we have come. Children do not die of smallpox anymore, and soon they will not have polio. With the challenge grant from the Gates Foundation, we have a real chance of ending polio completely in the next few years. I see the work of eradicating polio as a key part of my focus on child mortality.

Many of the projects that Rotarians are already involved in, in the areas of water, health and hunger, and literacy, already save the lives of countless children every year. I believe that by focusing our efforts on decreasing child mortality through work in these three emphases, we will be able to make a real difference in the number of children who survive to adulthood.

[Q] What image of Rotary should be projected today? Should the emphasis be on business networking potential or on humanitarian projects?

I do not think it is a choice between one and the other. Rotary has to be seen as a whole. Rotary was founded as a business networking tool, and service came after that. Service is now our primary focus, but that does not mean Rotary's role in business should be minimized. Rotarians should be in Rotary because they want to give, but we can and should also acknowledge the many benefits to Rotary membership.

[Q] Why do you feel the Rotary Youth Exchange program is so important?

It helps young people comprehend the world better. For young people, especially when they are living with host families, it is a kind of experience — an immersion experience — that cannot be duplicated. It brings rewards that are life-long and benefits that reach far beyond that one individual.

When I was a young man, I spent two years in California. I was a student, and I also worked as a busboy on Fisherman's Wharf in San Francisco. You could not imagine anything more different from my home village in Korea. Everyone was different, everything was different — the food, the people, the language. It completely changed how I saw the world, and it formed who I became in later life. I think I would still have joined Rotary, but I would not have understood it as well.

[Q] What inspired your choice of Make Dreams Real as the RI theme?

Part of why Rotary is so exciting for me is that we are able to do more through Rotary than we could do alone. We can do more as a club than we could as an individual, we can do more as a district than we could do as a club, and when you look at all of global Rotary, you can really dream big dreams. No one individual or even one government, no matter how powerful, could have done what we have done in polio eradication. In this year, my dream is that together we will be able to save the lives of children. That is my own dream. Part of that dream is knowing that children will be able to survive, to grow up healthy, to have better chances, to be able to see their own dreams become real in their lives.
