has a Purpose**

Edmond Dantès is the title character of Alexandre Dumas novel, *The Count of Monte Cristo*, also a film released in 2002.

Dumas got the idea for the *character* of Edmond from a story which he found in a book compiled by Jacques Peuchet, archivist to the French police. Peuchet related the tale of a shoemaker named Pierre Picaud, who was living in Nimes in 1807. Picaud had been engaged to marry a rich woman, but four jealous friends falsely accused him of being a spy for England. He was imprisoned for seven years. During his imprisonment, a dying fellow prisoner bequeathed him a treasure hidden in Milan. When Picaud was released in 1814, he took possession of the treasure, returned under another name to Paris and spent ten years plotting his successful revenge against his former friends.

This film is absolutely flawless. Aside from the utterly great acting of the actors, the dialogues are absolute products of a genius mind. It was also an all-embracing movie as it has combined comedy, action, revenge, treasure, romance, faith, hope, mercy and forgiveness.

Today's comic differs from the rest, as it will tackle mere hint of similarities between our characters. Nonetheless, we will embark on exceptionally profound analysis of personalities of Edmond Dantès and Rtn. Emil Dayrit.

To mention the hint of similarities, Rtn. Emil is as



debonair as Edmond Dantès portrayed by the stunning actor Jim Caviezel. Apart from the looks, their transformation is so alike. As the Count of Monte Cristo, Edmond Dantès projects greater depth and breadth of knowledge and his confidence grants him access to the highest levels of society.

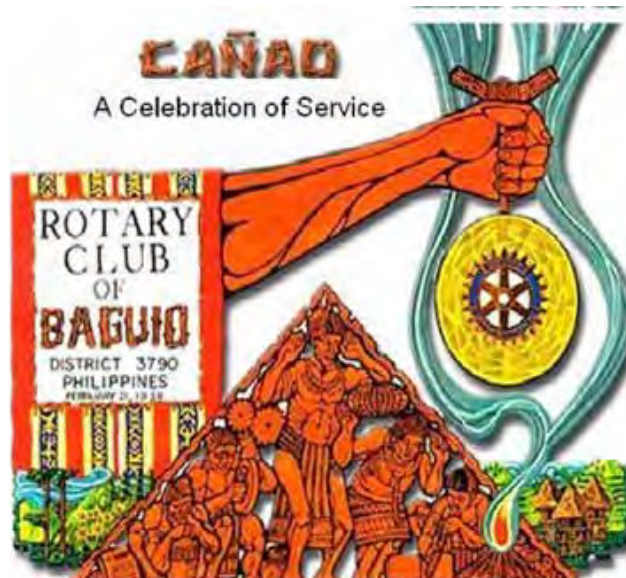

May we report to you the feedback of your COMPUTER donation to Taloy Sur Elementary School on its utilization.

1. Encoding of learning activities for individual pupils (instead of teacher writing on the board which is time consuming)
2. Pupils can work individually instead of sharing materials with classmates. There is concentration in doing one's work.
3. Serves as instructional aid –to view pictures from Encarta or disk related to lessons (instead of looking for pictures from other sources like magazines which sometimes is not available In school).
4. Teacher's accessibility to printed materials (Teachers can encode test materials like test questions, teacher-made class records and other evaluation materials, school reports, etc.
5. Teacher's positive values are displayed.
 - a. Resourcefulness- they sort to engage in sourcing out needed materials for computer use like coupon bonds, disk, USB for easy access and use.
 - b. Neatness and Orderliness- outputs are of quality as compared to pen craft.
 - c. Initiative ness-they initiate measures to seek help from knowledgeable and computer-literate relatives to teach them basic instruction on its use.
 - d. Cooperation-there is school- based computer- literacy from co-teachers as three teachers have a short background on it.
6. Academic performance- pupils showed better performance using printed materials.
7. Parents-Teachers closer ties- Parents showed enthusiasm for their children to be computer –literate as early as this time for them to be prepared for high school work.
