has a Purpose**

Dr. Henry “Indiana” Jones, Jr. (born July 1, 1899), also known as **Indy**, is a fictional professor of archaeology, adventurer, and the main protagonist of the 1981 adventure film *Raiders of the Lost Ark* (later re-titled *Indiana Jones and the Raiders of the Lost Ark*), its prequel, *Indiana Jones and the Temple of Doom*, and sequels *Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade* and *Indiana Jones and the Kingdom of the Crystal Skull*.

Indiana Jones, was first introduced in the 1981 film **Raiders of the Lost Ark**, set in 1934. He is portrayed as an adventurous throwback to the 1930s film serial treasure hunters and pulp action heroes, with an alter ego of Doctor Jones, a respected archaeologist at In this first adventure, he is pitted against the Nazis, traveling the world to prevent them from recovering the Ark of the Covenant).

The 1984 prequel **Indiana Jones and the Temple of Doom**, set in 1935, took the character into a more horror-oriented story, skipping his legitimate teaching job and globe trotting, and taking place almost entirely in India. This time, Jones attempts to recover children and a Sankara stone from the bloodthirsty Thuggee cult.

The third film, 1989’s **Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade**, set in 1938, returned to the formula of the original and the return of the infamous Nazi mystics, this time trying to find the Holy Grail.

The 2008 film, **Indiana Jones and the Kingdom of the Crystal Skull**, became the latest film in the series. Set in 1957, 19 years after the third film, it pits an older, wiser Indiana Jones against Soviet agents bent on harnessing the power of an ancient artifact. the plot revolves around a mysterious crystal skull that is discovered in South America by Harold Oxley a colleague of Professor Jones. He is aided in his adventure by an old lover, Marion Ravenwood and his son - a young greaser named Mutt Williams

Our Rotary doctor-hero is Dir. Ben Ladilad. The Department of Science and Technology Regional Director by profession and a Rotary adventurer by heart.

To enumerate some episodes in the equally thrilling exploratory life of our Dir. Ben Ladilad....

In October 2008, **Ifugao Offers Land for Jatropha**



Plants . Dr. Ben Ladilad, regional director of the Department of Science and Technology-CAR (DOST-CAR), said the local government of Alfonso Lista in Ifugao has committed an initial 12,000 hectares of land for jatropha plantation, and up to 32,000 ha for expansion. Ladilad said they have pledged to help the town in the processing of jatropha as biofuel when production reaches sufficient volumes needed for the conversion. Jatropha is a fast growing tree shrubbery that thrives in poor quality soil. It is an indigenous plant and is known among rural folk as a medicinal plant. Its bark and leaves, when heated, are applied to cure rheumatism and muscle ache.

The second episode, **Government offers subsidies for power saving inventions** , The Department of Science and Technology has been conducting a series of dialogues with inventors since April to find investors for any untapped research or gadget “that can help in the conservation or utilization of electricity,” said Ben Ladilad, DOST Cordillera director. In light of a slowdown in consumption due to increasing oil prices, government would also help in promoting new products to help sustain consumer interest, he said. Ladilad joined a Wednesday press conference called by the manufacturer of an engine performance additive called Magichanic oil. Ladilad said the DOST was not tasked with endorsing any particular product, but would go as far as promoting technology that make power use efficient and environment friendly.

In the final episode, our hero came strong as **DOST official defends Cordillera farmers** Ben Ladilad, DoST-CAR director, said that some vegetables with high pesticide content come not from the Cordillera but from other vegetable-producing areas in the country. Ladilad said it was the practice of some vegetable growers from other areas to bring their produce to the Cordillera before bringing these to Metro Manila and the other lowland areas to claim that their products were grown in the uplands. Ladilad said that because of their juiciness, highland crops have become popular among lowland consumers. Recognizing the hazards of the heavy application of chemicals on agricultural crops, several farmers in the region are gradually shifting to organic farming, Ladilad said.

Even without a whip, our true Cordilleran hero makes a difference to people lives, environment, government and beyond. He is man of wit and extreme talent and above all good heart – our leading man, Dir. Ben Ladilad.



October is Rotary Vocational Service Month

Vocational Service focuses on:

- Adherence to, and promotion of, the highest ethical standards in all occupations, including fair treatment of employers, employees, associates, competitors, and the public.
- The recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, not just your own or those that are pursued by Rotarians.
- The contribution of your vocational talents to solving the problems of society and meeting the needs of the community.

During October, Rotarians are encouraged to focus on this essential element of Rotary.

Discussions among clubs and districts on Vocational Service can lead to projects that not only develop the ethical consciousness and vocational skills of Rotarians but also the talents within their communities. Vocational Service month is an opportunity to begin year-long Vocational Service activities, ranging from Rotary discussions to awards to community projects.

- Devote the first meeting in October to examining the second Avenue of Service, including The 4-Way Test and The Declaration of Rotarians in Business and the Professions. After expanding members' awareness, solicit their input in planning projects for the remainder of the year.

- Introduce a "mini-classifications talk" series in which each member gives a five-minute talk on his or her vocation. Schedule one speaker for the beginning of each meeting until everyone has made a presentation. The purpose: promote vocational awareness among Rotarians and help them recognize the worthiness of all useful occupations.

- Present a vocational award to someone in the community who has exemplified outstanding professional achievement while maintaining very high ethical standards. Promote the presentation within the community, and consider making it an annual October event.

- Invite experts to give a presentation on the vocational needs of the community and develop a project in response to those needs. Possible projects could focus on developing character, providing career information to youth, mentoring small businesses, or organizing workshops that provide employees with new skills.
