Of course, hosts PP Mike and RAPP Mina were there and made us feel so welcome and comfortable with their warmth. But the best host of the Pearson family is Gabby. You could see in her the makings of a future Rotarian. Thank you PP Mike and RAPP Mina for opening your home to the club.

The speakers during the fireside chat, and of course, the other club members in attendance projected a very good image of the club as they were able to "close the deal" that night, so to speak. Cora accepted the invitation for her to become a member of our club and her induction is scheduled on 29 August during the club's regular meeting. I have no doubt that she will appear on the appointed date for she has shown admirable interest in our club from the first time she set foot in our meeting venue. Not only did she attend meetings. She likewise joined club activities like the extension of micro credit to the RCC of Luding and the orientation and induction of the SLU and UB Rotaractors. Members who have never attended one are enjoined to attend. You are guaranteed of an invaluable Rotary learning experience with good resource persons lined up for the day.

AS WE MEET TODAY, our future district trainors are attending the Rotary Learning Institute Seminar in Majarica Hotel, Tarlac City. The objective is to professionalize district trainors for them to be effective facilitators and educators based on Rotary International standards.

**ATTY. EDGAR M. AVILA.**

He is a true blue blooded **Baguio Boy**, born of an accountant and a public school teacher. He is a person of qualification, competence, independence and integrity, coupled with youth, idealism and honesty, the mandate for which the office was created would best be served.

He is a former **CONGRESSMAN** 48 years old, and a lawyer by profession having passed the Philippine Bar in 1985. He was born, educated, reared and worked in the City and a public school product from the Lucban Elementary School where his mother was a teacher.

As an accomplished lawyer, he has distinguished himself in the field of social engineering as a **Member of the House of Representatives** representing the **Youth Sector** in the **9th and 10th Congress** from 1992-1998. During his stint in **Congress** he was a member of the **Committee on Justice, Education, Constitutional Amendments, Public Order and Safety, Tourism, Youth Sports** and other significant committees. He was **Chairman of the Oversight Committee on Duty Free**. He has not only infused innovative ideas into the Congressional debates but, likewise, steered policies and programs towards being more responsive to the specific needs and aspirations of our people and the country. In his six year stint in Congress, he authored **84 Bills and Resolutions, 54** of which were of **National Significance**. As a neophyte Congressman he was able to sign into law, **four (4) bills** and was in the list of the country's **TOP TEN CONGRESSMEN** in 1996. Sometime in **August 1998**, he was invited to the **Academe** as the new **Dean of the College of Law of the Saint Louis University** effective **June 1, 1999** and at **39**, became the youngest **LAW DEAN** all over the country. He is not a stranger to the academe though, as he previously served as **Professor** at the **Commerce Department of the Baguio Colleges Foundation** and the **Saint Louis University**, where he obtained invaluable scholastic experience. He has lectured at the **PNP REGIONAL TRAINING CENTER**, Teachers Camp and presently a **Civil Law Reviewer** at **CCDC**.

The sparks that ignited the fame of his passionate quest for social change, justice and fairness started when as a young student, he was elected to the **Federation of Kabataang Barangays** in the **City of Baguio** as its **Vice President** where he spearheaded moves for wider youth representation in government and promoting programs to make them self-sufficient. Early on he was an outstanding

**Boy Scout** who achieved the highest possible rank in Scouting - the **JOSE RIZAL AWARD**. Significantly he was a **Philippine Delegate** to the **14th World Jamboree, in Oslo, Norway** in 1975 as well as a **1976 Youth Forum** in **Switzerland** where he presented a paper on the role of the Youth in Nation Building. He was the lone **Filipino Speaker** during the **World Scout Parliamentary Union Conference** in 1997. He was likewise a **Fellow** at the **University of New Orleans on Legislative Bill Drafting** in 1996.

He carries with him almost twenty years of practice in the field of law, having been associate of the **CABATO LAW OFFICE** from 1985 to 1992, before he became a **Congressman**. He now has his own **LAW FIRM** with **eight** associates. He is the **CHARTER PRESIDENT** of the **Rotary Club of Downtown Session** and wrote columns in both national and local dailies particularly the **Journal Manila Times, Baguio Reporter, Skyland News, the Weekly Tribune** and the **Cordillera Post**.

In 2002, he was nominated by the **Association of Law Students of the Philippines (ALSP)** and **Speaker Jose C. De Venecia** to be **Ombudsman**, and even if he was not able to get the post, the mere fact that he was one of the chosen few out of the hundreds of thousands of lawyers in the Philippines, was enough to make him and his family proud. In 2003, he was **Deputy** for the **Videogram Regulatory Board (VRB)**.

He was a co-founder of the **LAMP (LEGAL ASSISTANCE FOR MILITARY AND POLICE PERSONNEL)** assisting policemen filed with harassment suits or meritorious cases.

He is married to **BERNADETTE AREVALO-AVILA**, a businesswoman who has single handedly and successfully ran the family owned **MUSAR MUSIC CORPORATION** into becoming the biggest **School of Music** in the entire Luzon Area. They have four children, **JOHN PAUL, CHARMAINE MARIE, ANTON LUIS and YSABELLE THERESE**.

When he became a full pledge lawyer in 1985 he turned way from a life of luxury and comfort and instead poured his passionate attention to rendering service from the heart and legal aid to the poor, the disadvantaged and the marginalized. He has made a commitment to public service, and his unblemished record and reputation for integrity, honesty and dedicated service, make him an asset to the community.

### SYNOPSIS



## Pennies for Polio pays big dividends for Rotary's challenge

To Michael Leone, 2008-09 governor of District 7120 (New York, USA), the idea of inviting children to help protect other children against polio made perfect sense.

So when Leone and Past District Governor Michael Popolizio went to work planning Pennies for Polio in support of Rotary's US\$200 Million Challenge, they envisioned basing the fundraiser in the area's schools.

After receiving the support of the district Rotary Foundation committee and district advisory council, Leone presented Pennies for Polio to the club presidents in January through a letter, PolioPlus fact sheet, and PowerPoint presentation.

Fifty-eight Rotary clubs and 30 Interact clubs helped the project get underway in March and April by placing Pennies for Polio collection jars in schools throughout the district. School fundraisers lasted one to two weeks, with many featuring competitions among grade levels and a pizza party for the winning grade.

The Rotary Club of Honeoye Falls-Mendon produced a video about polio to show in local elementary schools and printouts for teachers to use with students in the classroom.

"The teachers used the project to teach children about world health issues and how polio once plagued the United States," says Honeoye Falls-Mendon club member Tracy Main. "To my amazement, the children raised over \$5,000 in 10 days."

Pennies for Polio tallied more than \$100,000 in all for Rotary's challenge.

"One of the most gratifying moments for me was to hear high school students educating their communities about the polio eradication effort and Rotary's work in this important task," Leone says.

"Ninety-nine percent of polio is already eradicated," said Jennifer Riekstins, a member of the Interact Club of Webster Schroeder High School, in a local TV news interview. "We're trying to eradicate the final 1 percent, and that's the most difficult, most expensive to do."

Added club president Carly Blake, "It makes us feel great that our community and our school are doing something to help other people in need."

Come on, let us not dampen the mood of the birthday guy....walk the talk - save the guy, save ourselves!





My fellow Rotarians:

Lord Byron wrote, “The days of our youth are the days of our glory.” For me, that is the line that springs to mind whenever Rotary’s youth programs are mentioned. In Rotary, September is New Generations Month – a time to focus our attention on our programs for youth and the role they play in shaping the Rotarians of tomorrow.

Our youth programs – Interact, Rotaract, Rotary Youth Leadership Awards, and Rotary Youth Exchange – are some of the most important programs of Rotary. I say this because of the unparalleled potential they have to influence young minds and souls toward peace, goodwill, and harmony. That potential is the greatest in youth because the experiences of our early years never leave us; they shape who we later become. In the words often attributed to St. Francis Xavier, “Give me a boy until he is seven, and I will give you the man.” For myself, I would give it a bit longer than that – but there is no doubt that the experiences of our youth have a greater formative power, and a greater ability to shape character, than any we may have in our adulthood.

When a teenager from the United States has the chance to travel to India to participate in a National Immunization Day, or when a student from Brazil spends a year studying in Japan, that person will be forever changed. Their perspective, their priorities, and their values will have been permanently shaped by that experience in a way that no later experiences will have the power to do. Your hard work ensures that these experiences continue to be possible – that these programs continue to be available, to be well run, and to earn the trust of the participants and their families.

The impressions of youth are strong, and they are lasting. There is never a second chance at them. We may grow and change as we get older, and we are surely changed by all of our experiences. But there is never another chance to build who we are. That happens only once: in our youth.

The days of our youth truly are the days of our glory – but through Rotary’s youth programs, those days become the glory of all of Rotary.
